Where are Tatiri products manufactured?

Approximately 90% of Tatiri products are made in the Philippines and the other 10% are made in China.

What kind of standard does Tatiri comply?

All Tatiri products conform to safety regulations and have passed safety tests. Tatiri toys comply with the EN-71 and ASTM standards.

What kind of wood or raw materials are Tatiri products made from?

Tatiri is committed to manufacturing under environmentally friendly conditions. The timber we use is from regulated plantation of pine wood from Australia and New Zealand. We are also using some wood from the Philippines regulated by the DENR.

What other kind of wood materials Tatiri items are made from?

Tatiri items are also made from Medium Density Board (MDF) from Australia and New Zealand. Our MDF is E1 standard—ensuring emissions of urea formaldehyde at levels below those acceptable to the World Health Organization (WHO).

Do you have a MSDS for your wood products?

Yes, our supplier provides us with their MSDS certificate.

What kind of paint is used on Tatiri products?

The paint we use is non-toxic, nitro-cellulose paint that has been scientifically tested by independent accredited laboratories and found to be safe for children and non-polluting in natural water sources. We periodically conduct a series of tests on our paints to make sure that the standards are always met.

How are Tatiri products assembled?

We do rigid and thorough research, study and experiment to assemble the items without using nails, while giving preference to glue, screws and pegs.

What kind of glue does Tatiri use to join the wood?

We use natural water base glue to do the joining work on our toys.

Do Tatiri products contain any phthalates?

The inks and paints used in Tatiri products have phthalate levels that exceed the Safety standards set by the EU. We endeavor to assure that all other materials adhere to the requirements of the EU.
